The status reports shall be submitted on a yearly basis by a predetermined date as agreed upon by all stakeholders.

WHEREAS, 70% (\$51,237.27) of the funding for these upgrades will be provided by the New Jersey, Board of Public Utilities, Office of Clean Energy through the Direct Install Program in the form of a grant; and,

WHEREAS, 30% (\$21,958.83) of the funding for these upgrades will be provided by the Borough of Edgewater in the form of a cash match.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Edgewater wishes to enter into a grant agreement with New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, Office of Clean Energy through the 2014/15 Direct Install Grant Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and/or Borough Clerk are required to sign any and all agreements that the Borough of Edgewater will enter into with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, Office of Clean Energy through the 2014/15 Direct Install Program.
